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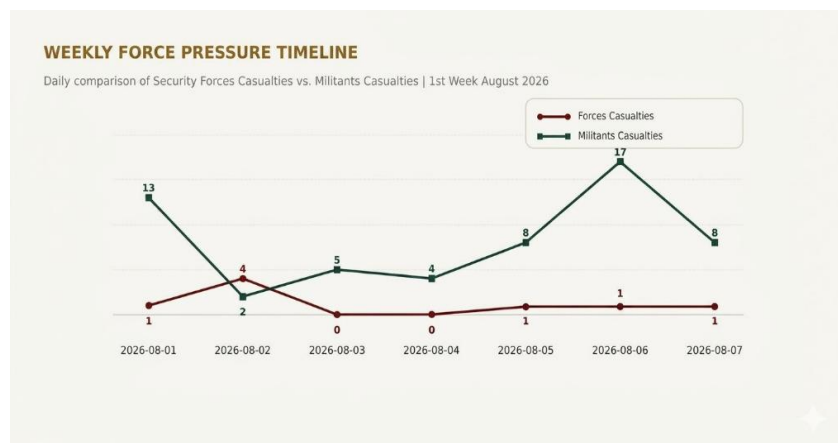


I. WEEKLY EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The security landscape during the first week of August 2026 (August 1–7) recorded 28 verified security incidents across Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) and Balochistan, including an August 2 suicide bombing at Kabal Police Station in Swat that killed 16 and wounded 22. State security forces maintained an aggressive counterpressure posture, executing high-yield intelligence-based operations (IBOs) and counterterrorism raids that neutralized 58 terrorists. Security personnel and civilians absorbed tactical friction, registering 12 security force and law enforcement fatalities (13 injured) and 12 civilian fatalities (10 injured). The period underscored a persistent operational tempo driven by state-led interdictions, targeted killings, and sporadic high-impact terrorist strikes.

II. OPERATIONAL & TACTICAL PULSE

- **Tempo & Trajectory:** The operational tempo exhibited sustained daily friction, peaking sharply on August 6 with 17 militant eliminations and 2 security force fatalities across multiple synchronized operations in Lower Dir, Bannu, Mastung, and Lower South Waziristan. Daily activity remained robust throughout the week, driven by continuous IBO sweeps.



- **Methodological**

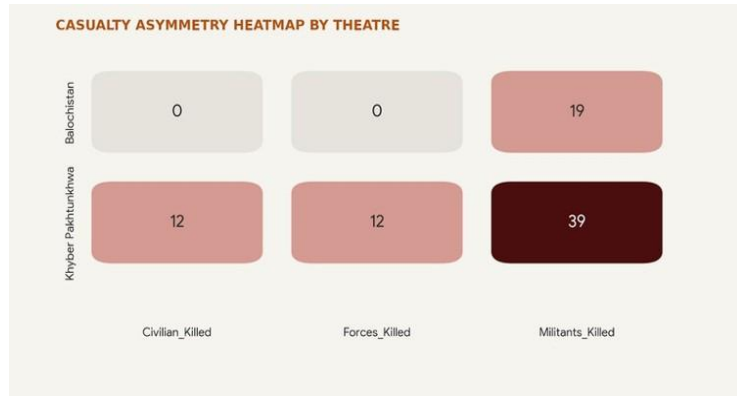
actors and state forces engaged through diverse tactical delivery vectors:

- **Intelligence-Based Operations (IBOs) & Firefights:** The primary vector for state counter-pressure, accounting for 12 distinct engagements and resulting in the overwhelming majority of militant eliminations (33+ killed).
- **Suicide Bombing & Direct Assaults:** A high-impact suicide bombing outside Kabal Police Station in Swat on August 2 resulted in 16 total fatalities (including 9 civilians and 7 police personnel) alongside 18 injuries.
- **Targeted Shootings & Asymmetric Harassment:** Multiple incidents of targeted killings claimed the lives of religious scholars, community leaders, and on-duty police personnel (such as Constable Mehran in Peshawar and Special Branch policeman Noor Alam Khan in Bannu).
- **Infrastructure & Sabotage Attacks:** Incidents included an IED blast near Peshawar (injuring 2 policemen), a bank raid and abduction in Hangu, and hand grenade attacks on police checkposts and schools in Kurram and Bajaur.

III. QUANTITATIVE & ASYMMETRY METRICS

- **Casualty Distribution Matrix:** Across the 28 recorded events, total aggregate losses stood at:

- **Militants:** 58 killed, 5 injured.
- **Security Forces and law enforcement agencies:** 12 fatalities, 13 injured.
- **Civilians / Religious & Political Figures:** 12 killed, 10 injured.



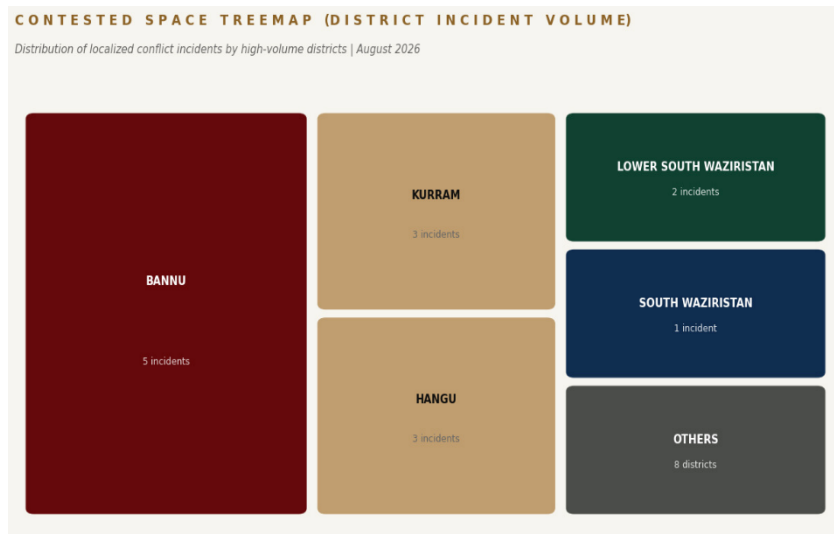
- **Theater Asymmetry & Regional Concentration:**

- **Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK):** Remained the primary focal theater with 24 incidents, recording 38 militant casualties, 9 security force fatalities, and all 6 civilian fatalities.
- **Balochistan:** Recorded 4 high-yield operations (in Nushki, Washuk, Mastung, and Kalat), successfully neutralizing 19 militants (6 in Washuk, 6 in Mastung, 7 in Nushki) with zero security force or civilian fatalities, though logistical disruption occurred via a passenger bus hijacking in Kalat.

IV. PROVINCIAL & DISTRICT HOTSPOTS

- **Contested Space Breakdown:** Conflict intensity was geographically fragmented across key hotbed districts:

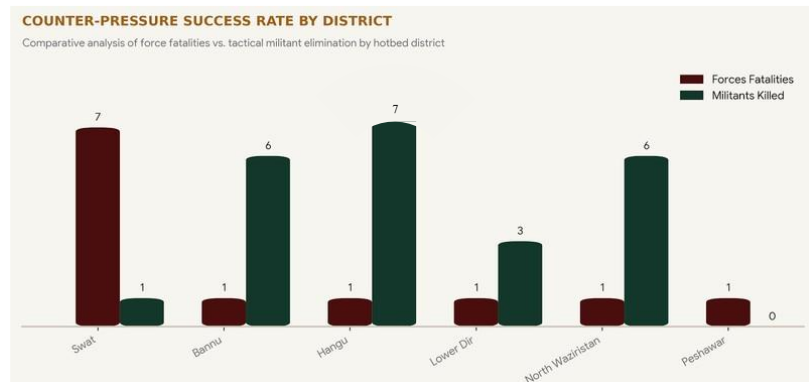
- **Bannu:** 5 verified incidents (including TTP neutralization in Jani Khel, the targeted killing of a Special Branch policeman, and ongoing operations).
- **Hangu:** 4 verified incidents (notable



for a drone/UCAV strike neutralizing TTP commander Ahmadur Rahman alias Muavia, a bank robbery/abduction, and a major IBO neutralizing 6 Gul Bahadur group terrorists).

- **Lower South Waziristan:** 3 verified incidents (featuring the targeted shooting of a JUI-F scholar, a blast in Wana claiming a pro-government teacher/jirga member, and a repulsed attack in Azam Warsak yielding 8 militant eliminations).

- **Peshawar, Bajaur, Khyber, and Swat:** Remained critical friction zones, with Swat absorbing heavy casualties from a suicide vest detonation and Bajaur seeing multiple targeted shootings and school harassment incidents.
- **Counter-Pressure Success Rate by District:**
 - **Hangu:** High-impact counterterrorism operation, neutralizing the TTP Orakzai chapter head and seven other terrorists, with one security force fatality, Captain Hamza.
 - **North Waziristan:** High state success ratio, neutralizing 6 militants (including key commander Asim Dawar) against 1 officer fatality (Major Hafiz Ahsan Elahi).
 - **Bannu & Lower Dir:** Maintained positive attrition ratios, successfully neutralizing multiple TTP elements during targeted raids and Operation 11 Garj extensions.
 - **Swat:** High-friction anomaly where force fatalities (7) and civilian casualties (9) outweighed militant eliminations (1) due to the Kabal Police Station suicide attack.

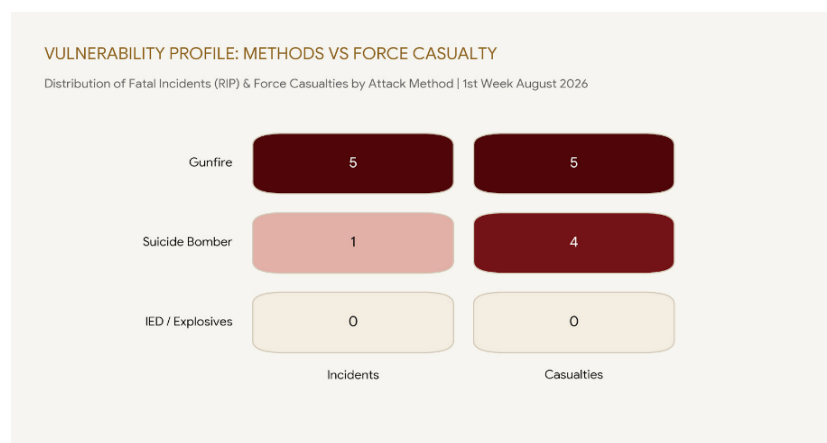


V. KEY STRATEGIC TAKEAWAYS

High-Yield State Interdiction & Command Attrition: State forces conducted effective intelligence-based operations, successfully eliminating high-value terrorist commanders (such as TTP commander Maviya in Hangu and Jaish-e-Umar commander Asim Dawar in North Waziristan) and neutralizing 58 total terrorists.

Asymmetric Vulnerability in Urban & Static Postures:

Static guard posts, police stations, and transit routes remain primary targets for asymmetric vectors (suicide bombings, IEDs, and targeted shootings), underscoring the urgent need for reinforced perimeter security.



Cross-Theater Divergence: While Balochistan operations benefited from effective preemptive IBOs, the KPK theater experienced complex urban and rural security challenges, requiring stronger community-level intelligence and hardened checkpoint defenses.



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
